- 2. Thrifting and upcycling old clothes are increasingly popular.

- 10. Color choices in clothing can affect mood and confidence. Write a persuasive piece about whether schools should educate students on color psychology and its potential impact on academic performance.
- 11. Many celebrities launch their own clothing lines. Convince your readers whether celebrity-endorsed fashion is worth the often premium price tag.
- 12. Fashion trends cycle through decades. Argue whether reviving a specific past fashion trend (like 90s style or Y2K fashion) represents appreciation or lacks originality.
