Setting the Scene





An introductory clause

comes at the beginning of a sentence and gives us extra information about the main action



Key points:

- Always comes **first**
 - While scrolling through TikTok during lunch break, Sarah discovered her own dance video had gone viral overnight.
- Needs a **comma** after it
 - Before the big championship **game**, Marcus practiced his free throws until the gym lights automatically shut off.
- Tells us when, where, why, or how
 - Although she had studied for hours, Emma found herself staring at the math test with sweaty palms and a racing heart. (shows us **when**)
